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- A. God's glory had departed the temple due to Israel's idolatry and rebellion. God sent His people into exile. "Now the glory of the God of Israel had gone up from the cherub on which it rested to the threshold of the house. And he called to the man clothed in linen, who had the writing case at his waist." (Ezekiel 9:3: 10:19; 11:22-23)
- B. God's glory did not appear in the rebuilt temple. The vision God gave Ezekiel of his glory was only seen by Ezekiel.
- C. God's glory was seen for the first time in approximately 600 years by shepherds in the field surrounding Bethlehem.
