God is going to No matter how big the opposition, how well organized they are, how powerful their weaponry, or how paltry the resources of God's people, ultimately the plans of God's enemies will come to nothing. (Psalm 2:1–5)  A. The church will ultimately be victorious. (Matthew 16:18)  B. Satan will ultimately be destroyed (Revelation 20:10)  C. God's victory eliminates to accusations against God: God is unable to protect his people (He is weak). God is unwilling to protect his people (he is malicious)  D. God's victory is can be seen in all his works. (Psalm 46:8–11)
111.	Ultimate of all who oppose him. Gog and his army end up as a massive array of corpses, scattered on the face of the earth. Their weaponry is useless against God's cosmic arsenal of fire and earthquake, hailstones and burning sulfur (Ezek. 38:19–22  A. The destruction is on a massive scale:  1. The discarded weapons will provide fuel for 7 years.(39:9)  2. The dead bodies will be a sacrificial feast for carrion. (39:17-20)  3. Seven months to bury the dead- to cleanse the land. (39:14-20)  4. A meticulous search for bodies and bones. (39:14)  B. The destruction will reveal the true nature of God (he is righteous) and the people (they are sinful). (Ezekiel 39:21–24)  C. The destruction of the unbeliever is a sobering reality. "Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we persuade others. (2 Corinthians 5:11)" (Revelation 20:11–15) "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God." (Hebrews 10:31)

(Romans 8:31–32) (2 Timothy 1:12)  B. Our victory is escape from the wrath of God. "(Romans 3:23–26)  C. Our victory gives us a settle assurance. "Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you."
