- A. A warning: Don't read our emotions onto God. He doesn't fee; the way we do. He cannot be manipulated by us. The doctrine of divine impassibility: impassibility is the doctrine that God is not able to suffer or be changed by involuntary passions... The basic concern here is an important one: the Bible is clear that God is not dependent on his creation in any way (i.e., he is truly transcendent), and therefore he cannot be at its mercy, involuntarily affected by it, reeling in reaction to what he has made, and thus on some level controlled by it.
